

erVII. **Simon Ebenretter**, Rector of Windsheim, *founding minor scholar* with 200 Franconian guilders *bef.* 1583, *bur.* 1 Nov. 1583, *m.* Kunigunde, childless. His mother Margaretha Möring, 3rd wife and widow of Johann Ebenretter, because she owed her sons, had to present herself, for the purpose of the payment for the *scholarships* of the minor Ebenretter children, in front of the local council in 1584. 100 guilders of the main sum were kept at the Council and 5 guilders had to be paid to the Mayor through the official channels at Easter and 100 guilders to servants for the care of the house and field. Guardians of Simon Ebenretter, the youngest brother of the witness Johann Ebenretter, were in 1550 Silvester Heubner, in 1539 Schöpf of Birkenfeld and furrier and innkeeper Hans Vehnn.

Klipper Scholarship History

Founded on 15 February 1606 by shoemaker Michael Klipper [of Hildburghausen] with the grant of 500 Franconian guilders, the Scholarship was initially intended for the sons and daughters of his brothers and sisters and the oldest [of its kind] by three years for the promotion of academic studies. If friends with the Klipper name and connection are not available, the remaining sum should continue to bear the interest but, in the case of the extinction of the Klipper family, it should be given to the relief of local students at impeccable Saxon universities. However, no one was to be admitted to the preception, as someone who had previously submitted to the elders of the family for the examination as well as proficiently shown the ability as the *protector* of the *benefits*.

In the family itself, the descendants of Deac[on]. Peter Klipper in Meeder had the precedence over the descendants of the other siblings. But in 1611, when a competitor, Joel Siegler, insisted that if there were 2 or 3 to study, no one should exclude the others, and they all should enjoy the scholarship at the same time, the executors of the testament obtained a verdict from the *Schöppenstuhl* [Supreme Court] of Coburg on 24 August in the s[ame]. y[ear]. that a cousin at the university should enjoy such a scholarship for a certain amount of time, but the others should not receive it, and should wait for another and be patient until the assignment comes to him.

When in the y[ear]. 1724 the Scholarship of the Friendship was withdrawn and about to be sent to the *Academic Gymnasium*, Reverend Barthol[omäus]. Nottnagel [the great grandson of Ursa Klipper Nottnagel, the sister of Shoemaker Michael and Deacon Peter Klipper] in Krügelheim with the local municipal secretary Pistorius protested, *in the best form of the law*, that that should not be allowed by the City Council so that a great responsibility, not GOD's wrath and disgrace, would arise from it because [the proposal] would be prejudicial to the dear youth, indeed the whole posterity, and would keep many of the poor souls in the Friendship from the studies.

The administration was provided at first by the eldest of the family but handed over to the council annually a list of scholarship holders with the calculation of scholarship funds. Later, the city syndicate received a *Thaler* for the collection and dispatch of the interest, while it administered the other scholarships free of charge. Because at first there were no studying sons of the family, the stock increased by 100 guilders but in 1769 54 Franconian guilders were reissued to the capital because there was a lack of sufficient oversight. In contrast, in the y[ear]. 1636 "because of ruinous warfare and quartering of Colonel Nicola [of the Imperial Army] the interest was kept in the tithes [*Censiten*] but in 1646 did not contribute at all to the ruinous quartering of the Arrsohn and Pentz people [of the Swedish Army, the regiments of Colonel Daniel von Arentsson and of Colonel Pentzen]." Under much difficulty and nuisance the Secretary of the Chamber [Johann] G[ottfried]. Lützelberger, as the eldest of the family next to Secretary Rottenbach and Court Advocate [Georg Friedemann] Habermann, brought the scholarship funds to safety and on the right foot, while he paid, as the contribution to the Princely Regional Tax [*Landschaft*], 28 guilders and 6 groschen from the annual interest.

Of the Klipper family, it should be noted that the oldest ancestors, Catharina and Anna Klipper, were found in Häselrieth [now a neighborhood in northwestern Hildburghausen] in 1497, and that a *M[agister]*. Crispinus Klipper died here in 1572 as a vice-rector. A Michael KI[ipper]., *b.* 1611, went in 1630 with the wanderings

and was 1652 a resident in Courland [now west half of Latvia, then a part of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth] ; a son of the same, Michael Kl[ipper], b. in Bauschke in Semigallia [now Bauska in the middle of Latvia, then a part of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth], came here in 1665 to fetch his father's inheritance, returned from here to Courland, Sweden and Denmark, Lübeck and Hamburg. A Margaretha Klipper, *mar[ried]*. in 1650 to master cloth-maker Hans Butz, was thought to have been trained by her grandson Greif Veihl's wife to learn witchcraft. So, she was therefore brought in 1657 to the torture and her whole body was so damaged by it that she was ailing until her death, *bur[ied]*. on 21 May 1660. A Hans Friedrich Kl[ipper]. b. 1703, d. 1751, was an East Indiaman [a merchant shipper with the East India Company]. The pastor of Haina, *M[agister]*. Johann Klipper, however, had written in vivid scenes a poetic description of the tribulations that the Dominion of Römhild had had to endure in the years 1634-1650; [it] is preserved as handwritten at the *Meininger Gymnasialbibliothek* [Gymnasium Library of Meiningen] and was edited in the Henfling Program of 1893 by Prof. K[arl]. Eichhorn [of the Gymnasium Bernardinum in Meiningen].

Michael Klipper's Testament

February 15, 1606.

Im taking the sacred, impenetrable triad: God of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: Amen.

Kunt, and evidently the most humane, with this open act, which, according to Christ our own Lord and Savior's womb birth, in seven hundred and six times to this Saturday, Septuaesima, the fifteenth month of July, two o'clock in the afternoon the Ersam and pursue Niede! Affran, and Margareth, to all the Klippers, and to dovish. Burgers all here. Before me to the end of me jury open But the body shall be in the earth, and there shall be his soul, and shall be buried in the earth. To change, His temporal / food, and the desire to leave / require, Sintemal the / Testator, as premeditated, no other, for his bodily brother and sister: And the same children and descendants, approach for the sake of goodness, in his despair, is the succession of heredity, and arranges and procures them from Christianity, and vindicates to God, to the cultivation of the rhe Christian religion, and to the serenity of his dear siblings children And their / their offspring, can be used. Scholarship Entitled Families.

Conrad also known as Cuntz Klipper, probably Paul Klippers, B. and Schuster's son, who was 1200 florins rich in 1515, and had been bred in Birkenfeld and Häselrieth, and had six children died before 1606 (his widow died 30 Mar 1614): 1. Michael, 2. Peter, 3. Kilian, 4. Barbara, 5. Ursa, 6. Margaretha.

1. Michael Klipper, born in 1558, the same company, B. and shoemaker, conveyed on 15 Feb 1606 a gift of 500 florin to an academic stipend for his full brother and sister sons who study (published 17.3.1606) and died single stand 17 Feb 1606. In the files of 1594 it says of him: "Me. Klipper, and Catharina Leichtin (?) Pt. Seortati, "in another place," that he had been overthrown by the adultery, and had been expelled from the country, had withdrawn from the day before.

2. Peter Klipper, born in Hildburghausen in 1560, cantor in Hildburghausen, 1594 rector, 1602 sub-deacon, 1605 deacon and 1610 Pastor in Meeder, buried there 23 Jul 1635 (possessed with other, good **Veßraer Lehn** in Leimrieth, 400 florins; had 4 Children: Matthias; Johann - single, 1619 probably Pastor in Rüdendorf and 1623 in Steinheid, where he was removed after 18 weeks of evil life; Paul, official in Kreinberg, died 1672; Jacob, the councilor in Coburg (his court yard from the paternal house bought Hans Rink and built a new house on it).
